#### CRP HELD 'NATIONAL VITAMIN A PLUS CAMPAIGN - 2021

National Nutrition Services (NSS) under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has implemented national vitamin A plus campaign like each year. So, as per government instructions CRP also held the similar campaign from June 5 to June 19, 2021. The campaign was coordinated by the Advocacy and Networking Department and the Lecturers of CRP Nursing College facilitated voluntarily. Due to the prevalence of COVID-19, the physical distance and hygiene of children and their parents has been strictly maintained during the distribution of the capsules. In the campaign, children aged six months to eleven months have had blue capsules while children aged twelve months to fifty-nine months have had red capsules. A total of 700 children including 200 children with disabilities received vitamin A plus capsules throughout the campaign. (Photo at left)

#### TRAINING OF THE TRAINERS: SPONSORED BY MAITS

CRP has successfully completed the Training of Trainers (ToT) training of two groups under Phase 2 on Neuro Developmental Disability (NDD) in collaboration with Multi-Agency International Training and Support (MAITS). Five Master trainers including physiotherapist, occupational therapist and speech and language therapist trained each group respectively in April and June, 2021. The trainees were parents of the children with disabilities, teachers of William and Marie Taylor Inclusive School and staff from the Community Based Rehabilitation Department. This 8 days training based on theory and practical sessions. All the trainees received certificates in the presence of CRP's Founder and Coordinator, Valerie Ann Taylor and Executive Director, Dr. Muhammad Sohrab Hossain, PhD. Strict protective measure and health guidelines were followed during this training due to COVID 19 pandemic.



### CRP DISTRIBUTED EMERGENCY DRY FOODS PACKAGES

As the world is experiencing the second wave of COVID-19 pandemic which affected the world economy along with the day to day lives of the people, it is known that people with disabilities are one of the most vulnerable groups in this situation. Most of these people are deprived of healthy diets due to lack of affordability or lost income source. In this situation, emergency food support plays a crucial role in order to meet the basic food needs of the people with disabilities and their families.

CRP with the support of American Friends of CRP, USA and Scott Bader Middle East Limited, UAE distributed 854 dry food packages within the most vulnerable people and people with disabilities in Bangladesh. Each package comprises of rice 10 kilos, pulse-2 kilos, potato-2 kilos, oil- 1 litre, salt-1 kilo, onion-2 kilos, flour-1 kilo, soap-1 pc, hand sanitizer- 250 ml, Vitamin C pack-125 gram, mask-2 pieces, and a meal. The Rehabilitation Wing of CRP along with the Centre Managers of other CRP sub-centres played a very important role to distribute these emergency dry food packages in time.
